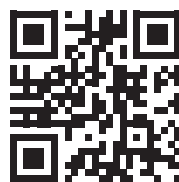
### Indication and Usage

Bylvay is indicated for the treatment of pruritus in patients 3 months of age and older with progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis (PFIC).

#### Limitation of Use:

- Bylvay may not be effective in PFIC type 2 patients with ABCB11 variants resulting in non-functional or complete absence of bile salt export pump protein (BSEP-3).

# About PFIC

Progressive familial intrahepatic cholestasis (PFIC) is a spectrum of rare, inherited, liver diseases. It causes itching that, until now, no medicine could effectively relieve.

The itching (pruritus) can be so severe that infants and children may scratch through their skin.<sup>1</sup> Many patients turn to surgery, including transplant, to relieve the itching.<sup>2,3</sup>





# What Happens in PFIC?

The body naturally makes bile acids that help with digestion, including absorbing fats and some vitamins. In people with PFIC, the normal flow of bile acids is disrupted. Bile acids build up in the body, damaging the liver.<sup>4,5</sup>

The itching PFIC causes may be so severe that children may scratch through their skin.<sup>1</sup>



## Relief from Pruritus in PFIC: Bylvay is Here to Help

Until recently, there have been no medical treatments approved for pruritus in PFIC. Patients often have been treated with surgeries, such as biliary diversion and liver transplantation, which all have significant risks.<sup>2,6-8</sup>

Bylvay (odevixibat) may change that. Bylvay is the first FDA-approved medicine to treat pruritus in PFIC. Bylvay is an oral medicine that is taken once a day.

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# A Chance for Relief from the Itch

Because of the severe itching it causes, PFIC can disrupt activities like going for a swim or relaxing at home. Bylvay gives patients a chance for relief from the itch.

Bylvay, the first non-surgical treatment approved for pruritus in PFIC, is proven effective in patients as young as 3 months old. Many patients had little or no scratching after 4 weeks on Bylvay.

## How Does Bylvay Work?

While it is not known exactly how Bylvay works, it is thought that by reducing bile acids in the blood, Bylvay may reduce the amount of itching PFIC patients experience.

Bylvay was studied in the largest clinical trial completed in PFIC patients. In the clinical trial, 83% of Bylvay patients and 85% of placebo patients experienced side effects. The most common side effects during the trial were diarrhea, liver test changes, vomiting, stomach pain and fat-soluble vitamin problems.

# Everyday Help with Bylvay



Bylvay is an oral capsule that is taken once a day in the morning with a meal. Your doctor will prescribe the right dose based on your child's weight.



It can be swallowed as a capsule or opened and mixed in a small amount (up to 30mL or 2 tablespoons) of apple sauce, oatmeal, banana or carrot puree, chocolate pudding, or rice pudding in a bowl. Food should be at or below room temperature. **Bylvay should not be mixed with liquid. Patients who only take liquid food should not use Bylvay.**



Patients taking bile acid binding resins should take Bylvay at least 4 hours before or 4 hours after the bile acid binding resins.



Bylvay does not need to be refrigerated.

- Bylvay may reduce the body's ability to absorb fat-soluble vitamins (FSV), which include vitamins A, D, E and K. Your healthcare provider will measure blood levels of these vitamins before and during treatment with Bylvay.
- **Do not mix Bylvay with liquids.**
- Do not swallow the 200 mcg or 600 mcg capsule(s) containing Oral Pellets whole. These are intended to be opened and the contents mixed into soft food. Take Bylvay in the morning with a meal.
- For patients taking bile acid binding resins, take Bylvay at least 4 hours before or 4 hours after taking a bile acid binding resin.
